**Whereas** Lambda-Eta Zeta at Murray State University has

- Violated multiple University and Fraternity risk management policies
  1. failed to follow Lambda Chi Alpha event planning procedures
  2. failed to enforce the University's guest list policy
  3. failed to sufficiently monitor the consumption of alcohol by its guest, and hosted an open party
- Lambda-Eta Zeta has been placed on Stage 3 Probation  
Chapter placed itself on Stage 3 Probation for violations of Lambda Chi Alpha's risk management policies.

**We move the adoption of this recommendation: and, therefore,**

Where as Terms of probation are self inflicted:

1. The General Fraternity's probation will run congruent with the probation set by Murray State University but will remain in effect for no less than one year. The chapter's progress will be reviewed by the Director of Chapter Services in January 2007.
2. The chapter will not conduct any social events during the Spring 2006 semester. After that, the chapter will be required to submit event planning forms for all events with alcohol at least 30 days in advance.
3. Hold the following five risk management educational sessions by December 31, 2006: \*LCA and FIPG policy, \*How to run a BYOB event, \*Social Host liability, \*Identifying and dealing with intoxicated persons, \*Effects of alcohol on the body. Eighty percent of the chapter must be in attendance at each session, all facilitated by outside speakers, and must included a one to two page summary of the event with signatures from the speaker and High Alpha or High Pi.
4. Fully implement a Risk Management Task Force, as prescribed in the Standards for Chapter Excellence II manual. Meeting minutes for the committee must be recorded by the task force.
5. The chapter must submit into Headquarters a Social Calendar of Events for the fall 2006 prior to hosting any social event/party.
6. The chapter must submit monthly reports outlining the chapter's status and progression. Monthly reports must include the following: Executive Committee minutes (1), chapter business meeting minutes (2), Risk Management Task Force meeting minutes (3), and a one to three page introduction page from the High Alpha (4).
7. The chapter must submit a letter to the Director of Chapter Services by completion of terms to request removal from probation

1 **Be it Resolved** that the Status of Chapters I at the 2006 General Assembly  
2 recommends to the Grand High Zeta that Lambda-Eta Zeta continue current probation  
3 sanctions until they are reviewed by the Director of Chapter Services in January 2007.  
4 In addition Lambda-Eta Zeta must submit a thorough case study regarding the above  
5 risk management violations under the guidance of Lambda Chi Alpha staff. The case  
6 study should also document how the chapter has been affected, how violations may  
7 have been prevented, and changes the chapter made to overall policies. It is the intent if  
8 of the case study to be a beneficial tool in the education of other chapters within the  
9 General Fraternity.

**Be it Resolved** that the Status of Chapters II at the 2006 General Assembly recommends to the General Assembly that Beta-Rho Zeta abide by the original staff recommendations:

- Continue with current terms of probation
- If Beta-Rho Zeta violates any risk management or hazing policies within the next year, its charter shall be revoked.

with the addition of:

- A retreat to occur, where all members and High Pi participate and sign off on the "Phoenix Plan," by September 10<sup>th</sup>.

16 staff, Beta-Lambda has received extensive information and training to increase their  
17 overall operational efficiency. Beta-Lambda has failed to utilize and implement the

20 **Whereas** Beta-Lambda has failed to meet the recommendations from the 2005 Status  
21 of Chapters committee:

- 22 -The chapter was placed on Stage 1 Probation due to operating
- 23 deficiencies. These deficiencies have not been resolved.
- 24 -The chapter must initiate fifteen new men over the 2005-2006 academic
- 25 year. The chapter currently has two initiated and two associate members.
- 26 -The chapter must maintain the minimum chapter operating standards. Of

30 **Whereas** as of October 7, 2005 the Grand High Zeta approved a board order declaring

Dissenting Opinion and Recommendation**

**Whereas** Colony 284 (Texas A&M International) has developed a payment plan to pay all debt to the general fraternity by the start of the fall semester. The colony completely overhauled the system with which dues were collected and realized the need to change that system. In recent months the debt of colony 284 was nearly at \$10,000. The colony has made great strides to reduce that debt and had a total debt going into the general assembly of \$6,865.23. Yesterday, High Alpha Joseph Holland presented a check for \$2,500 to reduce this debt to \$4,365.23. The colony has incoming funds to eliminate this debt.

**Whereas** The colony is heavily involved in the campus and the local community. The colony has brothers who are leaders. Brothers have served as student body president, president of the Greek Council, and chairman of the Campus Activities Board. Brothers also participate in the campus paper, pre-med, and pre-law programs and as a colony do Adopt-A-Highway. Between these many functions the colony demonstrates 100% participation in extra curricular activities.

**Whereas** The colony of twenty-three men maintains a 3.0 GPA far above the all male average of 2.5

**Whereas** Colony 284 demonstrates the ability to select dedicated quality men, having obtained a 100% initiation/association ratio during the 2005/2006 academic year.

**Whereas** The dissenting members of Status of Chapters III believe that there is great hope for the future fraternal experience at Texas A&M International. It is our belief that the brothers of Colony 284 have the intention, desire, and ability to become a chartered chapter within the next academic year. It is our further belief that recommending to close a colony on an eight to eight vote when it is apparent that the colony has so much potential to contribute to the life of the Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity is a contradiction to the principles expressed by the meaning of Zeta Alpha Chi.

**Therefore be it resolved** that the dissenting members of Status of Chapters III at the 2006 General Assembly recommends to the Brothers of Lambda Chi Alpha that Colony 284:

1. Must pay all debts to the General Fraternity by December 1, 2006.
2. Must submit revised bylaws to the General Fraternity, in accordance with the 51<sup>st</sup> General Assembly, by October 1, 2006.
3. Must have the acting High Pi approved by the Grand High Zeta by December 31, 2006.

**Whereas** James R. Favor & Co. suspended the liability insurance of Zeta-Omicron Zeta and the chapter has since been operating without insurance under the banner of Lambda Chi Alpha, and

**Whereas** Zeta-Omicron Zeta operating without insurance leaves the General Fraternity, not the insurance company, liable for any accidents that may occur at the chapter; we move the adoption of this recommendation; and, therefore,
